Description:	The project will develop a user-friendly coastal innovative land use guide (CILUG) focused on model regulations, land development standards and resource protection to inform municipal climate change adaptation and resilience actions. The project will also develop a framework for a regional sustainability and resiliency program.

Developing a Model Restoration Plan at Philbrick Pond for Enhancing and Scaling Salt Marsh Resilience

Recipient:	The Nature Conservancy
Description:	This project will build community support and momentum toward a resilient Philbrick Pond salt marsh system by developing a comprehensive and ready to implement restoration plan that considers all aspects of ecosystem and community resilience. The restoration plan will model salt marsh restoration practices that will be transferable and scalable to other historically impacted or degraded salt marsh systems for broader coastal resilience.
