Marking Requirements For Aboveground Storage Tanks (ASTs)

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) provides the below marking requirements for ASTs and AST Facilities regulated by <u>Env-Or 300.</u>

In accordance with Env-Or 305.03 tank markings on each AST are to be provided as follows:

Marking text shall be:

- 1. A minimum of 2" in height.
- 2. In a contrasting color to tank.
- 3. Permanently painted or affixed to the AST.
- 4. Located where it is visible to the individual filling the AST.

The following shall be displayed on drums with no connected piping:

1. The Petroleum Product Stored in the Drum.

a. For example: Diesel, Gasoline, No. 2 heating oil, Used Oil for Recycle, etc.

The following shall be displayed on all other ASTs:

1. The Tank Number.

a. The tank number shall coincide with the number on the <u>AST Registration Form</u> submitted to NHDES by the facility owner.

2. The Petroleum Product Stored in the Tank.

a. For example: Diesel, Gasoline, No. 2 heating oil, Used Oil for Recycle, etc.

3. The Safe Fill Volume or Fill Height.

- a. This corresponds to the product level that will activate the high-level alarm installed in the tank as required by Env-Or 305.11(b).
- b. The units of this marking must correspond to the units of the tank gauge required by Env-Or 305.11(a).

4. NFPA 704 Identification of the Hazards of Materials for Emergency Response Symbol.

- a. Values in each portion of symbols shall be verified by product supplier.
- b. Symbol to be located, at a minimum, on approach side for emergency responders.
