NOTICE OF REESTABLISHMENT OF A GENERAL STATE PERMIT

Pursuant to the New Hampshire Rules Code of Administrative Rules, Env-A 620.06, notice is hereby given that the Director of the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services, Air Resources Division (Director), has completed a proposed general state permit for the source category described below and intends to reestablish the general state permit in accordance with Env-A 610 and Env-A 620:

Source Category:

Internal Combustion Engines – Emergency Generators or Fire Pump Engines

Description of the General State Permit:

The source category “Internal Combustion Engines – Emergency Generators or Fire Pump Engines” is applicable to one or more internal combustion engines operated at a source as an emergency engine, where:

1. Each device combusts liquid fuel oil and has a design gross heat input greater than 0.15 MMBtu/hr, and the combined total design gross heat input for all such devices is greater than or equal to 1.5 MMBtu/hr; or
2. Each device combusts gaseous or liquefied propane gas fuel and has a design gross heat input greater than 1.5 MMBtu/hr, and the combined total design gross heat input of all such devices is greater than or equal to 10.0 MMBtu/hr.

The proposed general state permit is on file with the Director, New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services, Air Resources Division, 29 Hazen Drive, P.O. Box 95, Concord, NH 03302-0095, (603) 271-1370. Information may be reviewed at the office during working hours, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. Any person who wishes to request a public hearing regarding the proposed general state permit shall do so by submitting a written request to the Director, at the address listed above, no later than **Friday, April 17, 2015**. The written request for a public hearing shall contain at a minimum: the name and address of the person(s) filing the request; the reason(s) that a public hearing is requested; and the material issue(s) which the person would like to have addressed at the hearing. Written comments on the proposed general state permit and/or requests for a public hearing, filed with the Director no later than **Friday, April 17, 2015**, shall be considered by the Director in making a final decision.
